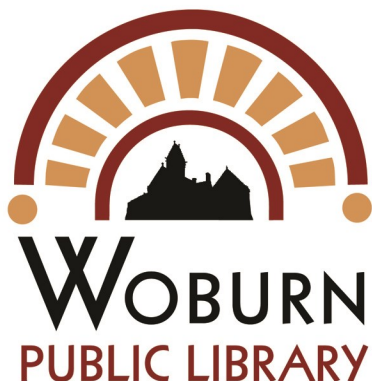
ENJOY eBooks & audiobooks

Common and rare animals from all around the world will help you write a great report for school, or satisfy your curiosity about animals you'd like to learn more about.



United States history and current events, landmarks, special places, biographies, and even politics can be found in this database.



There are bits of everything in this database, from help with homework in subjects like math, reading, social studies and science, to fun information on sports teams, arts & entertainment, and inventions. What will you find?



Once you click on this database, look at the left hand side of the page. You'll see that you can choose ages 0–8 years, or 9–12 years. Once you've chosen your age, you can see what books are recommended, then check and see whether the Minuteman Libraries own them. You can type "Like Wimpy Kid" and get not only all the Wimpy Kid titles, but also other titles you might enjoy!
