The City of Woburn Board of Health and Mayor Galvin will join the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on May 29th, 2021 in rescinding all COVID-19 restrictions, except for remaining face-covering requirements for public and private transportation systems and facilities housing vulnerable populations. All industry restrictions will be lifted, and capacity will increase to 100% for all industries. The gathering limits will be rescinded.

All industries will be encouraged to follow CDC guidance for cleaning and hygiene protocols.

Face Covering Guidance

In line with CDC face covering guidance, the City of Woburn will follow the State of Massachusetts timeline and will rescind the current face covering order and will follow the new face covering advisory effective May 29th.

Non-vaccinated individuals are advised to continue wearing face masks and to continue distancing in most settings. The advisory will also recommend fully vaccinated individuals no longer need to wear a face covering or social distance indoors or outdoors except for in certain situations.

Face coverings will still be required for all individuals, regardless of vaccination status, on public and private transportation, health care facilities and providers, congregate care settings, and health and rehabilitative day services.

Face coverings will also remain required indoors for staff and students of K-12 schools and early education programs.

City of Woburn business owners will be free to make their own decisions regarding which, if any, COVID-19 protocols, and practices they choose to keep in place. Mayor Galvin and the Board of Health ask patrons to kindly respect all individual businesses as they begin to navigate through the next few months.
